INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADULTS – STEP BY STEP

How to Prepare the Treasure Hunt

- 1. **Print** the vocabulary worksheet and clue cards.
- 2. **Start with the worksheet**: Children complete the vocabulary chart, speaking questions, and drawing task.
- 3. When they finish, give them Clue 1 to start the treasure hunt.
- 4. **Hide the clues** in the following locations:
 - o Clue 1: Hand this directly to the child.
 - o Clue 2: Hide near a fan (handheld or electric).
 - o Clue 3: Hide near or inside a ball or toy box.
 - o Clue 4: Hide under or inside a summer hat.
 - o Clue 5: Hide on a sunny windowsill.
 - Clue 6: Hide under a pillow or inside a sleeping bag/bed.
- 5. **Treasure**: Hide a small **prize** under the pillow or in the bed (certificate, stickers, toy, or book).
- Celebrate! Help the children open the treasure and review the vocabulary they found along the way.

Español:

Cómo preparar la búsqueda del tesoro

- 1. **Imprime** la ficha de vocabulario y las pistas.
- 2. Comienza con la ficha: los niños completan el vocabulario, las preguntas orales y el dibujo.
- 3. Cuando terminen, entrégales la Pista 1 para comenzar la búsqueda.
- 4. Esconde las pistas en los siguientes lugares:
 - o Pista 1: Dásela directamente al niño/a.
 - o Pista 2: Escóndela cerca de un abanico o ventilador.
 - o **Pista 3**: Escóndela junto a una **pelota** o caja de juguetes.
 - o Pista 4: Escóndela dentro o debajo de un sombrero de verano.
 - o Pista 5: Escóndela en una ventana soleada.
 - o Pista 6: Escóndela debajo de una almohada o en un saco de dormir/cama.
- 5. **Tesoro**: Esconde un **premio pequeño** debajo de la almohada o en la cama (diploma, pegatinas, juquete o libro).
- 6. ¡Celebrad! Ayuda a los niños a abrir el tesoro y repasar el vocabulario.


