How to go about this part

- **Read the Entire Text First:** Quickly read the whole text to get a general understanding of its meaning and tone. This will help you predict the type of word needed for each gap (e.g., noun, adjective, verb, or adverb).
- **Examine the Base Word:** Each gap has a base word in CAPITAL LETTERS to the right of the text. Your job is to change this base word into the correct form.
- **Identify the Word Type Needed:** Look at the structure of the sentence before and after the gap.
- **Consider Grammar and Meaning:** Check for clues in the sentence:
 - **Plurality:** Does the word need to be singular or plural?
 - **Tense:** Is a verb in the past, present, or future needed?
 - **Adverbs:** Does the sentence require an adverb to modify a verb or adjective?
- **Apply Prefixes and Suffixes:** Common transformations include adding prefixes (e.g., *un-*, *dis-*, *re-*) or suffixes (e.g., *-ly*, *-ness*, *-able*). Be mindful of irregular changes (e.g., *happy* → *happiness*).
- **Fill in Each Gap:** Write your answer clearly. Make sure it fits grammatically and makes sense within the sentence.
- **Review Your Answers:** After completing all the gaps, re-read the text to ensure your answers flow naturally and are free of errors.
