
FCE Lesson Plan: World Book Day

🔏 Be Brief but Natural

- **Don't over-explain.** Respond concisely and clearly but don't give a **monologue**. Keep answers to around **30-40 seconds**.
 - Use **natural expressions** and **fillers** to sound more conversational:
 - "Well, I guess..."
 - "Actually, I've never really thought about that, but..."

👍 Give Full Answers

Avoid answering with just 'yes' or 'no'. Always try to expand your answer:
"Yes, I enjoy reading. I think it helps me relax, especially after a long day of work."

👌 Add a Personal Touch

- Personal experiences help you sound more **authentic**. Try to connect each question to something **you really do** or **have done**:
 - o "I usually read books in the evening. Last week, I finished a mystery novel that was really exciting!"

🔏 Be Honest but Creative

- If you don't have a strong opinion, try to **speculate** or give a thoughtful answer based on your general feelings:
 - o "I don't usually read e-books, but I think they can be convenient when traveling."
 - o "I think books are great, but sometimes I don't have time to read as much as I would like."

🖞 Use a Range of Vocabulary

- Variety is key! Try to use a mixture of **simple** and **advanced** vocabulary. You can make simple topics sound more interesting by using varied vocabulary:
 - "I enjoy reading novels because they allow me to escape into different worlds."
 - o "I'd rather listen to audiobooks when I'm commuting or cleaning the house."

🔏 Focus on Fluency, Not Perfection

- In **Part 1**, the examiner is looking for fluency, not perfect grammar. So try to speak **naturally** and **confidently**, even if you make small mistakes. If you're unsure about something, try to keep the conversation going:
 - "Hmm, that's a tough question, but I'd say I prefer fantasy books because they are more imaginative."

- 3. Partner Talk: Which book would you prefer to read? Why?






EXAMPLE SPEAKING SCRIPT:

In both pictures, I can see people who are enjoying books.

However, there are some **key differences**. In the first picture, the book club members look absolutely **pumped** to talk about their books, while in the second picture there's a woman enjoying a quiet, solitary reading moment.

In the first picture, they're really **vibing** with each other—everyone seems super **chatty**, and the conversation is flowing naturally. Some people are leaning in, totally **hooked** on what's being said, and others look like they just heard something **mind-blowing** about the book, while in the second picture, the atmosphere is completely different. Instead of a lively group discussion, she seems completely **chilled-out**, sinking into their book with no distractions. Her expression shows that she is **lost in thought**, as if the story has transported her somewhere else. Everything about the setting feels **laid-back**—a cozy spot, soft lighting, and a relaxed posture. You can tell she's totally **in the zone**, absorbed in the book's world and disconnected from everything else.

Both images show the power of books, but in completely different ways—one through social connection and discussion, and the other through personal escape and reflection.
