

Part 1 - Bingo


How to play:

1. Give each student a bingo board. Teacher calls out words (or describes them: "It's black and it flies at night" = bat).

List of words (call them out in any order!): bat / black cat / ghost / haunted house / monster / pumpkin / skeleton / spider / sweets (candy) / trick or treat / witch / witch hat

- 1. Children mark the picture.
- 2. First to complete a line shouts "Boo!"





Part 2 - Creepy Cool Charades

Cut out the Halloween actions/characters on slips of paper:

One student acts, the others guess: "You're a witch!" / "You're carving a pumpkin"



- Starters: just mime the characters in **bold** (witch, vampire, bat).
- Movers/Flyers: use full actions so students guess with complete sentences: "You are carving a pumpkin."

Part 3 – Haunted House Board Race

How to play:

- 1. Divide the class into 2–3 teams. Draw one column on the board for each team
- 2. Teacher reads one of the prompts: "Name something you eat at a Halloween party" / "Write a scary animal".
- 3. First student from each team runs and writes one example in their column. They pass the marker to the second student, who writes a new word. The team with the most correct answers after 1 minute gets a point.
- 4. Continue with different prompts. Team with the most points wins.

Prompt Bank (teacher calls out categories):

- Name something you wear on Halloween. (costume, mask, hat, cloak, cape, boots...)
- 2. Name something **you eat** at a Halloween party. (cake, sweets, biscuits, pizza, chocolate...)
- Name an animal connected to Halloween. (cat, bat, owl, spider, rat, crow...)
- 4. Name something **scary**. (ghost, monster, skeleton, witch, zombie...)
- 5. Name something you find in a **haunted house**. (cobweb, candle, mirror, window, door, coffin...)
- Name a colour we see at Halloween. (black, orange, purple, red, green...)
- 7. Name a **sound** you might hear on Halloween. (scream, laugh, cry, shout, howl, music, footsteps...)

Tips for Success

- Keep prompts short and clear.
- For **Starters**, allow one word (cat, cake, bat).
- For **Flyers**, require short phrases (a big black cat, chocolate cake).
- If space is tight, use paper taped to the wall instead of the board
